


ANNUAL REPORT 2021

We started the year optimistically anticipating that this would be a better year than 2020. It was until Covid struck again and we were forced into lockdown Level 2 in September. This resulted in the cancellation of monthly meetings from October-November. The Committee decided it was too complex to manage the Covid rules of a maximum number of 100, social distancing and food restrictions. The recent move to orange on the 'traffic light' system means we are able to hold a final meeting in December.

The Annual General Meeting is normally held in November. Because this didn't happen the committee decided to roll over and hold an election of officers in February 2022. It was also decided to reduce the subscription to \$20 for 2022 as a compensation for meetings missed in 2021. Because of covid restrictions only those fully vaccinated (or with an official exemption certificate) are able to enter the Papanui Baptist Church. This may be a consideration for some when deciding to renew their membership.
